Regulations for Dual Degree Application in the Master's Program of the Department of Law, National Chung Hsing University

Passed in the 127th Department Affairs Meeting on January 5, 2021

- Article 1 To expand students' learning areas, these regulations are formulated in accordance with the university's dual degree regulations for students.
- Article 2 The department shall allow Master's program students to apply for or withdraw from a dual degree program within two weeks from the start of registration for each semester. The application deadline shall be based on the period announced by the department each semester.
- Article 3 Applicants for the dual degree Master's program in this department must hold a bachelor's degree in law from a domestic university or have completed a dual degree program in law at the undergraduate level with supporting documentation.
- Article 4 This regulation shall not apply to students enrolled in the Master's Program for Working Professionals.
- Article 5 Master's Program students may apply for a dual degree in the Department starting from the second semester of their first year.
- Article Applicants for a dual degree program in this department shall obtain the consent of the department chair of their original program of study. Applications must be submitted within the timeframe specified by this department, along with a completed application form and an academic transcript issued by the Registrar's Office. Approval from the department chair of this department is required before submission to the Registrar's Office for record.
 - Master's program students applying for a dual degree program must also obtain the consent of their original academic advisor in addition to meeting the requirements set forth in the preceding paragraph.
- Article 7 Matters not covered by these regulations shall be handled in accordance with relevant university regulations.
- Article 8 These regulations shall be implemented after being passed by the Departmental Affairs Meeting. The same procedure shall apply to any amendments.

In case of any dispute, the explanation should be based on the Chinese version.
