

# **Regulations for Credit Transfer in the Bachelor Program of the Department of Law, National Chung Hsing University**

Passed in the Joint Meeting of the Department of Finance and Law and the Institute of Technology and Law on July 8, 2010

- Article 1        These Regulations are formulated by this Department to address matters related to student credit transfer, in accordance with the University's Regulations for Credit Transfer and other applicable laws and regulations.
- Article 2        Credits earned from courses taken at junior colleges or vocational high schools shall not be eligible for transfer. However, credits for non-specialized legal courses completed at an academic level equivalent to that of a university may still be transferred in accordance with these Regulations.
- Article 3        Courses completed more than four years prior to the application for credit transfer shall not be eligible for transfer.
- Article 4        Credits earned from general education courses shall not be eligible for transfer toward professional subject credits.
- Article 5        Credits obtained from credit programs not offered by this Department shall not be eligible for transfer.
- Article 6        Credits for courses from a semester that do not meet the total credit requirements for that academic year are not eligible for transfer.
- Article 7        Only courses with a grade of 80 or above are eligible for credit transfer. However, applicants who believe their academic performance in the course is exceptional may apply for an oral examination conducted by relevant faculty members of this Department. Credits may be transferred upon passing the oral examination.
- Article 8        These Regulations shall be implemented after being passed by the Department Affairs Meeting. The same procedure shall apply to any amendments.
